OVERVIEW

St. François Xavier Community School is located 12 km west of Winnipeg on Highway 26, a short drive north off the TransCanada Highway at the White Horse Plains monument. Opening in September 1992, 2017 marks the 25th year of our present school. St. François Xavier Community School offers English programming from Kindergarten to Grade 6, serving a number of communities including St. Francois Xavier, Cartier, Elie, St. Eustache, and Fannystelle. Over the years, our school has demonstrated a strong record of academic achievement in literacy and numeracy. This is largely attributed to a dedicated staff that brings the best teaching practices into their classrooms. With Music and Physical Education specialists, extra curricular opportunities include clarinet, choir, and athletic activities, which are frequently offered during the noon hour and after-school. Yoga, Mathletics, and Tech club are also available for the students. Technology supports are part of every classroom, incorporating such tools as Smart boards, iPads and Chromebooks, as well as, a dedicated computer lab that includes a 3D printer.

Our results are on track to meet the target goals for grade 2 and slightly under for grade 6.

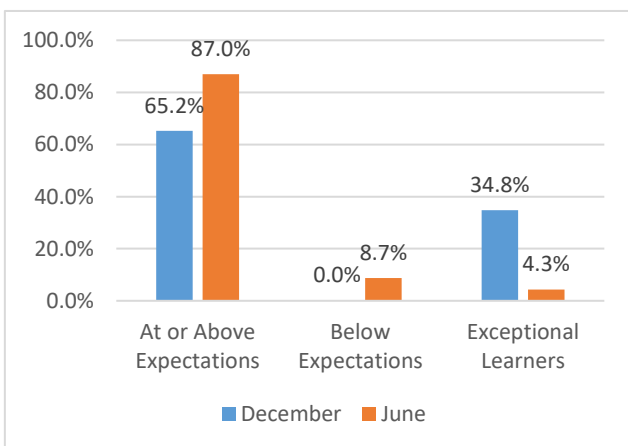
Next Steps

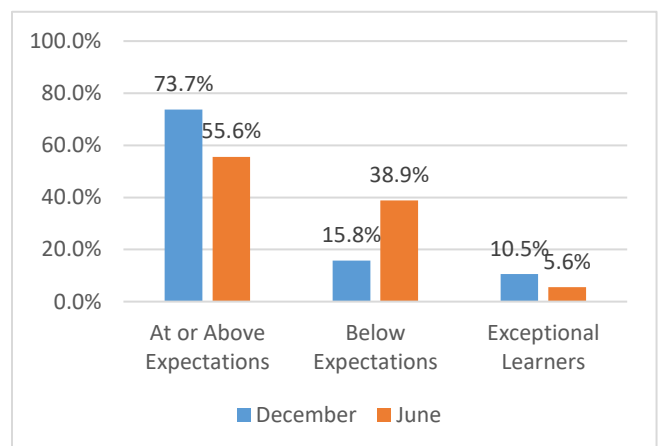

85% of SFX students will meet the grade level expectations for Basic Operations and Number Sense.

Accomplishments

Grade 2 results for 2017 are 90.91%; Grade 6 results are 85.71%. We are meeting and exceeding our target goals.

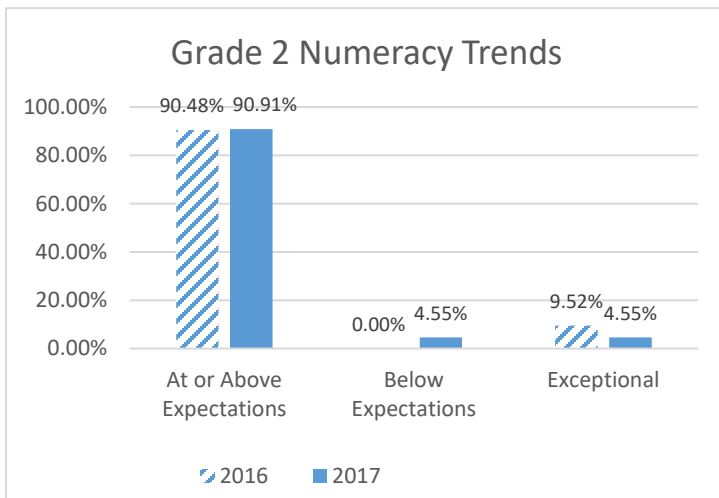
Next Steps

We will continue to work towards meeting our goals while increasing our focus on mental math and problem solving strategies. We will also continue our participation in national mathematics contests.

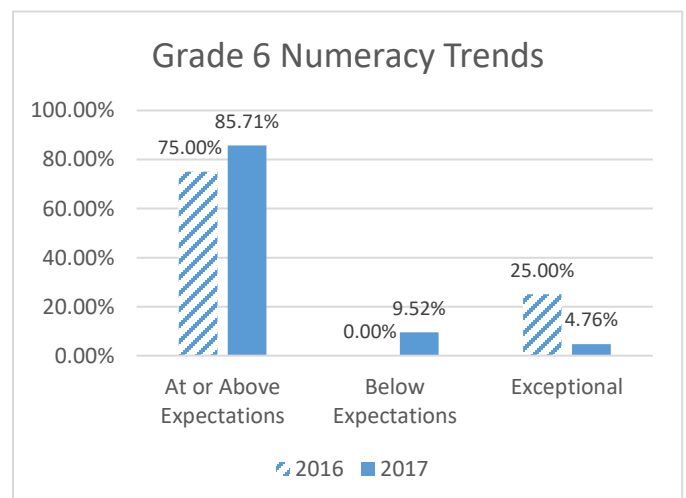
